## Blue Rapids Community Foundation

The Blue Rapids Community Foundation "Circle of Giving" match day is currently scheduled for Tuesday, September 15. MCRHS participated in the inaugural match day in June of 2019 and received approximately \$1,645 in donations and \$878 in "match money" from the BRCF. All things considered, we do not expect to do as well this year.

The money is invested with the Greater Manhattan Community Foundation, who are the financial managers. Donations can be made in person on September 15 or online through the BRCF web site. MCRHS members will be sent a letter with additional information about 2 weeks prior to the "Circle of Giving" Match Day.

## Publicity Fund

Our greatest expense each year is insurance. Our second greatest expense is chemicals for ROW maintenance. Next comes publicity. It costs us about \$108 per year for web site hosting and another \$15 for domain name registration. Including postage, it costs us about \$56 per month for the newsletter (\$560 per year for 10). With the reduction in business due to COVID-19 we are only putting out a newsletter every other month, thus generating a little savings. Included in the newsletter cost is printer ink, which runs about \$185 per year. We also print a few hundred brochures to display in various locations and hand out to passengers. Our publicity budget therefore runs about \$683 per year. A \$20 donation to the publicity fund doesn't seem like much but every bit helps.
