A light meal will be served at the Weaver Hotel and serving homemade ice cream at "Somewhere" is under consideration.

## Welcome to the 2017 Ride Season

The normal operating season for rides on the CBRR is April 1 through October 31. Last year our first ride was on March 5 and as noted on page 1 we already had our first ride this year on February 19. Normally a ride can be scheduled for almost any time as long as the weather permits. The safety of our rides is our #1 priority so the board decided last fall to have passenger safety signs installed on the two passenger cars. The signs read as follows:



#### Passenger Safety

- •Remain Seated while the car is in motion.
- •Keep your hands, arms, legs, & head inside the car.
- •Watch out for hanging branches.
- •No alcohol beverages / No smoking.
- •Listen to & follow all crew instructions.
- •Enjoy the ride.

Additionally, a checklist for drivers was put into printed form and a log will be kept for each ride. **Motorcar/Passenger Car Checklist** 

- Gasoline
- Oil
- Inspect engine
- Radiator fluid
- Brake tension
- Brake linkage
- Wheels/Bolts
- Fire Extinguisher

It should be noted that none of these are new procedures, but the MCRHS board felt it would be better if our emphasis on safety were more visible. This information is included in the newsletter for the same reason.
