We are currently working out details for some major crossing repairs involving the removal of the wooden crossing members and replacing them with an asphalt hard surface crossing. This project involves crossings in both Blue Rapids and Waterville.

The Vista RD crossing east of Blue Rapids is gravel crossing that is difficult to maintain, both for RR use and for the Vista RD traffic. Replacing the gravel crossing with a hard surface crossing is something on our wish list.

Forms are also available for pickup at the Community Center.

- Individual contributions to charitable funds ranging from \$25 to \$1,000 per organization will receive a prorated match. If a donor gives a \$5,000 gift split evenly between five organizations, then based on such contributions, each group would be eligible to receive additional matching funds.
- When donating by check, one check must be made payable for all donations made by a donor to the **BRCF**. A separate form will be used to indicate which organizations will benefit from the donation, and maybe downloaded from the match day website.
