Membership Meeting and Dedication

The Story Behind The Block Signal Light

Several years ago, Ken Oppenlander, a MCRHS life member from Manhattan, KS became acquainted with a railroad buff from Missouri named Richard Dodd. He brought Mr. Dodd up to Waterville and Blue Rapids to see the CBRR operation and ride the rails in a motorcar. Upon returning to Missouri, Mr. Dodd saw a block signal light for sale by David Pendergast in Springfield, MO. Mr. Dodd offered to buy the block signal and donate it to MCRHS. When Mr. Dodd inquired about buying it and stated his intention do donate it to a historical railroad group in Kansas, Mr. Pendergast said if Richard was willing to trailer the block signal 300 miles he would donate the signal himself.

So there you have it. David Pendergast donated the block signal, Richard Dodd hauled it up from Springfield, MO and Ken Oppenlander was the liaison with MCRHS.
