Pending Projects

On Tuesday, August 23, Mike Blaske, a retired Architectural Engineer inspected the Waterville Caboose and made recommendations about replacing the siding.. Following discussion at the September 8 board meeting Kenny Winkenwader contacted Mark Critchfield (local contractor) about pouring concrete bases for both the signal light that was donated to the MCRHS and the railroad traffic semaphore. The traffic signal light will probably be placed near the replica steam locomotive and the semaphore will likely be placed near the shed for the Waterville motorcar. The traffic signal is being erected as a memorial to Marc Lamoreaux and will be placed as soon as the railroad crew can get to it and. The traffic semaphore will need some restoration work before it can be set in place.
